

Biography: Kim Mawhinney

Kim Mawhinney completed a PhD in biology at the University of New Brunswick in 1999. Her work examined crèche attendance and duckling survival of Common Eiders (*Somateria mollissima dresseri*) in the Southern Bay of Fundy and Northern Gulf of Maine. In 1999, she joined Parks Canada Agency as the Species at Risk Co-ordinator for their Atlantic Region; and in 2003, re-located to Newfoundland with the Canadian Wildlife Service as a senior biologist to manage the Species at Risk Program for Newfoundland and Labrador. She is involved with a variety of programs which include species at risk recovery, habitat stewardship, species at risk on federal lands, the Ecogifts program and species at risk act communications to facilitate SARA compliance.
